INTRODUCTION

Directorate General Civil Defence (DGCD) is a functional unit of the Ministry of Interior Government of Pakistan established under Civil Defence Act-1952, as a war oriented organization responsible for passive defence of the country. Its war oriented assignments including development of Air Raid Warning network in collaboration with Pakistan Air Force and camouflaging of Key points in collaboration with KPID/Engineering in Chief Branch, GHQ and preparation, Civil Defence plans in collaboration with the relevant entities. One of the peace time major roles of Civil Defence is to conduct specialized training courses through its training institutions covering various aspects of Civil Protection such as Fire Prevention & Fire Fighting, Counter IED tactics and techniques, Bomb Disposal, Camouflage, Disaster Management, Rescue, Nuclear Biological & Chemical Warfare and First-Aid etc.

2. Civil Defence Training is one of the primary means through which the Civil Defence Pakistan reaches out to all segments of population. It aims to equip nation with essential life-saving skills to be utilized during national emergencies.

3. Ten (10) Federal Civil Defence Training Institutes established across the country have provided free-of-cost Civil Defence related training to **8899** Master Trainers (Male & Female) belonging to public/private sector organizations, Armed Forces, industrial workers general public and women etc during the year 2021.

4. The latest edition contains updated information regarding all core activities under taken in year 2021.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- a. To automate the Air Raid Warning System for compatibility with that of PAF.
- b. To establish / modernize components of Air Raid Warning System such as Federal Monitoring Cell (FMC), Warning Operation Centers (WOCs) and Combined Control and Reporting Centers (CC & RC)

2. Establishment of Federal Civil Defence Training School Sukkur.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Project forms an integral part of the Development Program launched for peace time role assigned to the Civil Defence department by the Parliament and to prepare the nation to minimize loss of life and property during any war eventuality or any natural & man-made disaster. The objective of the Federal Civil Defence Training Institute at Sukkur is to provide training facilities in various aspects of civil protection to the people of upper Sindh as well as Southern Punjab. In the 1st Phase, the Institute will be established in suitable hired building with its full-fledged working. The other targets such as construction of building of Institute and hostel and purchase of land will be achieved during 2nd phase of the Project.
